
SYNOPSIS

Once upon a time, deep in the Arizona desert, in a small town of little interest to the world, there was a group of brave teenagers who decided to put on a play about their own lives - and to play themselves as convincingly as possible. All the teenagers had emotional baggage and big dreams for the future but feared deep down that they would remain just that: fantasies.

Playing themselves, the teenagers found the courage to confront traumatic events from their childhood and ask questions they would otherwise not have dared to ask: Do we have to love our parents even when they keep us from growing freely? Are we indebted to them from birth?

Faced with the challenges standing in the way of their freedom, the teenagers began to invent an alternative reality for themselves, beyond their play, in which they were strong enough to seek revenge, to reach out, to leave loved ones behind. They imagined themselves as characters in a movie...

Behind this unconventional documentary fantasy is prolific Danish filmmaker Jon Bang Carlsen who has argued passionately against objectivity since the 70s and dedicated much of his career to finding new ways of excavating truth from reality by way of dramatization.



DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Although I have made more than 40 of them since I graduated from The Danish Film School in the late 1970s, the documentary form, and the expectations around it, continue to challenge me as a filmmaker. I was always provoked by the practitioners of this art form that stubbornly claim to be able to separate reality from dreams, which in my world is like trying to separate body and soul. To me reality and dreams are like conjoined twins, if one dies both will perish.

When I drift into the realm of fantasy with my protagonists in Dreaming Arizona, it is in no way a question of me turning my back to the truth. On the contrary. The fictional elements constitute an attempt to add extra layers to my portrayal of five young, American teenagers living in a remote town sandwiched between the railroad tracks and the freeway, and in the vastness of the neighboring Navajo Nation. Their hopes and fears about the freedom they will face in adult life, and the turmoil back home that threatens to clip their wings, are at the core of this movie.

Together with the teenagers from Winslow High School's drama club, I go further into the wilderness of truth and fiction than ever before. The film gradually loses its grip on reality as I, the storyteller, together with my protagonists, develop their documentary stories into a hypothetical fantasy about what might happen later in their lives, based on the knowledge that the film already has acquired about them and their inherent conflicts and dreams.

It is my hope that this kind of fictionally augmented reality will offer the audience an even more realistic portrait of the world in which these young Americans live.


